The non-suit is a mere default or neglect of the plaintiff, and therefore he is allowed to begin his suit again upon payment of costs; but a retraxit is an open voluntary renunciation of his claim in court, and by this he forever loses his action.” 3 Blackstone Com. 296. And it has been held that a judgment of dismissal, when based upon and entered in a pursuance of the agreement of the parties, must be understood, in the absence of anything to the contrary expressed in the agreement and contained in the judgment itself, to amount to such a judgment of the court, as will constitute a defense to another action afterwards brought upon the same cause of action.
